I am pleased to offer Film and Philosophy again this year. I loved hearing last year about the ways it inspired creativity, sparked great conversations, opened the kids' minds, and enhanced their appreciation for literature and film! For those not familiar with F&P, we watch great movies over pizza and beverages, then dissect them through discussion of themes, symbolism, imagery, philosophical ideas, cinematography, and questions raised by the films. We delve below the plot of a movie to explore what lies beneath the surface, often finding layers of meaning you might not have realized were there, even if you'd seen the movie before.
